A Traditional Passover Meal (Seder Meal) will be prepared and presented by Renee and Michael Jarvis on Maundy Thursday evening, March 28 at 6:00 p.m. Attendance is limited so **please RSVP to Cori or Diane by Monday, March 18.**

The evening begins with the story of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob who recall their people's suffering and persecution as they were going out of Egypt.

This traditional meal will include readings, partaking in drinking 4 sips of wine, telling stories, eating special foods, singing, and other Passover traditions. Food includes wine (juice), vegetables dipped in salt water, matzah (cracker-like bread), bitter herbs (horseradish and romaine dipped in charoset, a paste of nuts, apples, pears and wine)

This meal will be followed with more familiar dishes to round out the Seder meal.
