Great Life-Giving Spirit, I face the West (black), the direction of sundown. Let me remember every day that the moment will come when my sun will go down. Never let me forget that I must fade into you. Give me a beautiful colour, give me a great sky for setting so that when it is my time to meet you, I can come with glory.

Great Spirit of Creation, send me the warm and soothing winds from the South (red). Comfort me and caress me when I am tired and cold. Unfold me like the gentle breezes that unfold the leaves on the trees. As you give to all the earth your warm, moving wind, give to me, so that I may grow close to you in warmth.

The month of June starts a year of the United Church's 100th anniversary—an opportunity to honour our past and look to the future!

The theme for the Centennial is <u>Deep</u>, <u>Bold</u>, <u>Daring</u>. One of the first "united" churches in the world, from its formation the United Church has been rooted in:

Deep Spirituality

The words of Jesus' prayer that the disciples be one

Bold Discipleship

The belief that what unites us is stronger than our differences **Daring Justice**

The desire to live out the gospel call to love and justice in Canada and around the world

June 10, 2025 marks the hundredth anniversary of the beginning of the United Church of Canada. On that day representatives from the Methodist, Presbyterian and Congregationalist churches got together in the Mutual Street Arena in Toronto to formalize the union of their three churches. This was the outcome of people from these churches working together, during the years preceding 1925, on common programmes. This cooperation was especially true in western Canada.

In this hundredth year, leading up to June 10, 2025, the Archives group of Waterford United Church plan to tell you some of the stories from the history of the United Church of Canada. Our stories will appear in the church bulletin, and will begin in July 2024.

We realize that we will not be covering the entire history of the United Church of Canada, but we hope that we will be choosing topics which interest you.
