CGIT / EXPLORERS

We are continuing our series from the history of the United Church of Canada from its beginning in 1925 up to the present. Today's theme is CGIT and Explorers both nationally and locally.

CGIT - In 1915 a small group of ecumenically minded individuals representing the YMCA and YWCA and the Anglican, Baptist, Methodist and Presbyterian churches formed a committee to study the needs and interests of teenage girls and come up with an outline for the CGIT program. Girls conferences were held across Canada. These were weekend events including Friday night and Saturday sessions, a Saturday night banquet and Sunday afternoon church service. By 1920, churches were convinced of the value of CGIT as a church centred program.

Here at Waterford United Church, the first reference to CGIT is in the1947 Annual Report. A group of church women organized a GGIT group which met in the basement of the old church. It was a very large, open space in that part of the church, and according to Mrs. Olive Woodard, one of the organizers of the group, discipline was a challenge with 20-25 lively girls, but that the program was a good preparation for life. GGIT continued off and on it seems, over the next 20 years. In 1982 Barb Stewardson, Sandra Hannah and Andrea Borsy were leaders of the CGIT group, assisted by Christine Cameron-O'Neill and Mary Anne MacGowan. The Waterford CGIT worked with a similar group from Villa Nova. The two groups shared activities with CGIT groups in other area churches.

The Waterford and Villa Nova groups worked together to attend the Jamboree at Algonquin Park in 1985. After a beautiful sunny Friday and Saturday, a torrent of rain swept through the campgrounds Saturday night. Many of the tents were flattened and some of the girls and leaders went to Huntsville, where kindly folks took the soaked sleeping bags and clothing to their homes to dry and provided comfort and shelter until morning. Not to be daunted by this experience, in 1990 cars were loaded once again and a group headed off to Sarnia for the Jamboree. The theme of "wet tents" continued. This time the group departed in the rain AND came home in the rain.

Explorers - Explorers was developed as a program of Christian Education for juniors, aged 9 to11, too young to be part of the CGIT. In 1950, Mrs. Olive Woodard organized an Explorer group. They enjoyed singing, food, hikes, crafts and helping with various church and community activities. They shared mutual experiences with the CGIT, such as the Christmas Candlelighting service and the Mother and Daughter Banquets. In 1980, the Explorer group was reorganized with membership fluctuating between 5 and 15. Leaders during this period were Eileen Henderson, Linda Ramage, Susan Stevenson, Suzanne Stewardson, Hiida Sostar,, Jennifer Hannah. This group remained active until 1990.
